Thank you for supporting our Officer and Enlisted Associations. Please discuss, share, and debate the challenges we can attack in order to make our North Dakota National Guard stronger.

History of the Auxiliary

On August 30, 1973 (at the 2nd EANGUS Conference) 44 ladies representing 16 states met in Hotel Fort Des Moines, Des Moines, Iowa, to discuss the possibility of forming a National Auxiliary to EANGUS. Following much discussion, it was voted to form a National Auxiliary. Temporary officers were elected. The following year was spent working on a constitution and by-laws.



The organization meeting of the EANGUS Auxiliary met October 1, 1974 in the Gull Room of the Biloxi-Sheraton Motel in Biloxi, Mississippi. The acting temporary president (Mary McKamey of Louisiana) conducted the business sessions. The Constitution and By-laws Chairman presented the constitution and by-laws which were accepted. Officers were elected for 1974-1976. Area Directors were elected by their respective areas. Doris Williams of Mississippi was elected the first president.

At the Fourth Annual Conference in Colorado (1977), the membership voted to start a scholarship fund with the proceeds from a raffle. The Scholarship Committee set the requirements that an applicant must be the son, daughter, or spouse of an EANGUS Auxiliary member and must have a letter of endorsement from their state Auxiliary president.

On March 3, 1978, the Executive Board of EANGUS Auxiliary approved an emblem for the Auxiliary. It shows the Minuteman and Colonial Lady standing side by side with the name of the organization encircling them.

Committees

There are several types of committees involved in the efforts of **EANGUS**:

Standing Committees - Appointed by President and approved by Executive Council with the number of committee members determined by President.

General and Special Conference Committees - Credentials and Rules Committee. Not more than five members of the Executive Council. Appointed by President and Approved by Executive Council.

Other Appointments - Appointed by President and approved by Executive Council.

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) was formally organized in 1972 with the goal of increasing the voice of enlisted persons in the National Guard. As such, EANGUS is a non-profit organization dedicated to the principles of providing an adequate national defense and promoting the status, welfare, and professionalism of the men and women of the Army and Air National Guard by supporting legislation that provides adequate staffing, pay, benefits, entitlements, equipment, and installations for the National Guard.

Beginning with twenty-three states, EANGUS now represents all 50 states, Guam, Puerto Rico, the US Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia, and has an association comprised of those who serve the National Guard on national tour. With a constituency base of over 414,000 soldiers and airmen, their families, as well as thousands of retired members, and headquartered in Alexandria, Virginia, a stone's throw from Washington DC, EANGUS maintains a full-time staff to represent your interests to the Pentagon and on Capitol Hill.

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) has established the EANGUS "We Care For America" Foundation Inc. (WCFA). WCFA provides Scholarships, Awards, Patriotism Awareness, Veterans Against Drugs Program and the National Guard Soldier and Airmen Emergency Relief Fund.



SUPPORTING YOU, BECAUSE WE ARE YOU

Since the 1860's, many U.S. Soldiers in North Dakota were Freemasons. They started masonic lodges in Dakota Territory at Fort Burford and Fort Pembina. In 1898, the First Regiment, United States Volunteers of North Dakota embarked for the Philippines. Many of those men were freemasons, who brought the tenants of freemasonry to that country. Lt. Col. Treumann, Major White, Major Fraine, and Lt. Col. Gilbert C. Grafton—whose names we all know—were freemasons there. What they started there, later became a national organization called the National Sojourners.

From Medal of Honor Recipients to Adjutants General, Freemasonry is an integral part of the North Dakota National Guard.

Today, the North Dakota Masonic Foundation is a 501c3 that has supported many charitable organizations. We've supported the North Dakota Military Museum project, Veterans Cemetery in Fargo, Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library, George Washington Masonic National Memorial, and many more.

GOVERNOR KELLY ARMSTRONG



Kelly Armstrong took office as the 34th governor of North Dakota on Dec. 15, 2024 and brings a background in business, a love for the outdoors and a passion for volunteering and public service to the Governor's Office.

Kelly is a lifelong, devoted North Dakotan and a tireless advocate for making North Dakota a better place to live, work, and raise a family.

Kelly was elected to the U.S. House of Representative in 2018, representing North Dakota's at-large congressional district. During his tenure, Armstrong was an advocate for energy independence, agricultural interests and conservative fiscal policies, reflecting the priorities of his largely rural and resource-rich home state.

A staunch supporter of North Dakota's oil and gas industries, Armstrong worked to advance legislation aimed at reducing regulatory burdens and promoting domestic energy production. He has also championed policies to support farmers and ranchers, advocating for fair trade agreements and federal assistance during economic challenges.

In Congress, Armstrong was an active member of the House Judiciary Committee and the House Energy and Commerce Committee.

Prior to his congressional career, Kelly served in the North Dakota Senate from 2012 to 2019 representing District 36. He spearheaded legislation to reform DUI laws and pass a \$2 billion statewide investment into our infrastructure. Kelly was elected Chairman of the North Dakota Republican Party in 2015 and led the party to landslide victories for President Donald Trump, Gov. Doug Burgum, and ND Legislative Majorities. His legal background as an attorney has influenced his legislative priorities and contributions to legal and regulatory debates.

Kelly grew up in Dickinson, he earned his bachelor's degree from the University of North Dakota and received his law degree in 2003 from UND as well.

Kelly married his wife Kjersti in 2004 and they have two children, Anna and Eli.

BRIGADIER GENERAL MITCHELL R. JOHNSON



Brig Gen Mitchell R. Johnson is the North Dakota National Guard Adjutant General and Director of the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services (NDDES) at Bismarck, N.D. The department provides 24/7 emergency communications and resource coordination with more than 50 lead and support agencies, private enterprise, and voluntary organizations to assist local jurisdictions in disaster and emergency response activities. It administers federal disaster recovery program and the Homeland Security Grant Program. NDDES also manages the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) that serves as a national clearinghouse through which member states may request and provide mutual aid assistance.

Brig Gen Johnson was commissioned in May 1997 through ROTC at Michigan Tech, Houghton, Mich. He was selected for an Air Force Institute of Technology Civilian Institution Program and earned his Master's Degree in 1998. Upon completion of pilot training, General Johnson served in multiple flying assignments in AMC, AETC, and AFSOC during his 12 years on active duty. He has held command at the Wing, Group and Squadron level, and flown tactical aircraft, special

Outstanding Company Grade Officer - Air Capt Kyle Knutson | 177th Intelligence Squadron

Capt Kyle Knutson serves as the 177th Intelligence Squadron (IS) Assistant Director of Operations, overseeing the daily production of serialized intelligence reports produced by 76 analysts for three USAF Major Commands, four Combatant Commands, and the United States Intelligence Community on behalf of the Air Force Targeting Enterprise. In 2024, Capt Knutson led the stand up of a technical electronic signals intelligence exploitation team consisting of 10 highly skilled Airmen analysts who quickly adapted their communications intelligence backgrounds to discover

new and unique signals of interest as part of a high-priority Headquarters Air Force mission. Under his oversight, this mission evolved to include over 20 Airmen analysts from three Air National Guard units and paved the way for new methods of large data transport, exploitation, and operationalization. Capt Knutson also oversaw the research and serialized reporting efforts of 12 members who produced 14 products for the United States Intelligence Community. Furthermore, Kyle prepared the 177 IS for a critical Air Force Cryptologic Office inspection. He assessed requirements, assigned subject matter experts, and coordinated activities across 15 inspectable areas while reviewing 338 checklist items and ensuring 10 visiting inspectors had access to required workstations and critical programs. His contributions directly resulted in the 177 IS receiving a 100% compliance rating during the inspection along with a rarely given "best seen to date" accolade from the inspection team. His actions reflect the core values of the Air Force and have significantly contributed to the success of the 119th Wing.

Lt Col Gregory Ames serves as the 178th Attack Squadron Director of Operations where he successfully led over 70 members in a constantly evolving and increasingly contested 24/7/365 combat environment. Furthermore, he volunteered to work a new combat line rotation on behalf of the Air National Guard Operations Group Council, reducing the mission planning cell burden by half. In 2024, Lt Col Ames led efforts

As the lead instructor, Lt Col Ames ensured mission readiness by personally certifying 15 aircrew members from the Operations Group and two Marine Corps aircrew in satellite-only operations.
